ASIAN PACIFIC AMERICAN STUDIES

The Asian Pacific American Studies (APAS) minor is an interdisciplinary undergraduate degree option that will allow students interested in complementing a major degree with the study of demographic, cultural, social, economic and policy issues that have shaped and continue to affect Asian American and Pacific Islander communities in Arizona, the Southwest United States, nationally, and internationally.

RELATED AREAS

Foreign Language Requirement

Students pursuing Bachelor of Arts in Justice Studies must demonstrate intermediate proficiency in a second language by completing the courses specified below with a grade of “C” (2.00) or higher in each course. Second-language course requirements may be fulfilled in one of the following ways:

- Completion of second language course work at the intermediate level (202 or equivalent). Those students completing this requirement in Ancient Greek must take both GRK 301 and 302; students completing the requirement in Portuguese or Romanian must complete POR 314 or ROM 314.
- A foreign language course at the 300 level or higher taught in the foreign language and having 202 or its equivalent as a prerequisite.
- Completion of secondary education at a school in which the language of instruction is not English.
- Completion of SHS 202 American Sign Language IV or its equivalent.
